Chairman Art Herbon read the following statement "The SCAC provides a forum for citizen involvement and information on issues affecting unincorporated areas in South SLO County. The objective of the SCAC is to advise County Government entities on those issues."

Community Presentations –

SLO Board of Supervisors – Jocelyn Brennan Legislative Assistant presented a Certificate of Recognition and flowers on behalf of the 4th District Supervisor to Istar Holliday for her service to the SCAC and Land Use Committee. She stated that SLOCOG is now the transportation authority for SLO County; that the County is moving forward with a ballot initiative for the November General Election to raise the County sales tax .5% in an effort to become a self-help County for road maintenance and improvements; that Marinai Hotel developers will be submitting to County Plans in the future; provided an update on the County's intent to limit occupancy for homes supporting commercial concerns; that the County is currently reviewing and updating Code definitions , presenting more options for Agricultural Concerns and are working to make it easier to have farm support housing in San Luis Obispo County.

CALFIRE no representative in attendance

SLO Sheriff's Office Commander Donovan stated that for the month of March there were 861 calls for service which equated to roughly 30 calls per day; there were 40 arrests, 24 reported thefts, 3 assaults, 5 cases of vandalism and 6 trespassing cases; he also stated that Proposition 47 has reduced many Felony crimes to Misdemeanors and many Misdemeanors to notices to appear. He spoke about a recent Internet scam case in the area that resulted in the loss of \$80,000 to a local elderly family.

California Highway Patrol SGT Johnson stated that the new traffic lights at Nipomo High School would be turned on at the end of the school year; requested letters of support or opposition to the lights at Willow and Pomeroy be submitted to his office; that 4 traffic citations had been issued and that there has been a marked increase in the number of homeless walking on the freeway and county roads. **NCSD** Dan Woodson stated a notice to proceed had been authorized for the Joshua Station reservoir; that total rainfall for the year at Southland Plant was 6.97 inches and at Nipomo East at 8.62 inches; total water production for the year was 1280 acre feet. (see attached report for complete details)

Nipomo Chamber of Commerce President Dave Nilsen talked about the upcoming Spring Street Fair on May 21st.

Lucia Mar Unified School District Andy Stenson stated that LMUSD Schools are very safe with suspensions and expulsions rates being lower; that cameras were now installed in all District busses; that Nipomo has 2 of the 3 oldest schools in the District (Nipomo and Dana)
